

It is with deep sorrow that we announce the passing of Gregg McInerney, who was tragically struck and killed by a vehicle while walking outside of High Springs, Florida, on August 13, 2025. He was born in Saginaw, Michigan, on May 10, 1952, to the late Arthur and Virginia McInerney.

Gregg was a beloved father, brother, and friend, known for his sense of humor and witty smile. His passion for fishing was a defining part of his life. Gregg moved to Frankenmuth at a young age and graduated from Frankenmuth High School in 1970, where he made his mark as a starting linebacker for the 1968 and 1969 Frankenmuth Eagles State Football Champions, setting several records, including most fumbles recovered in a single season that stands today.

An adventurous spirit, Gregg was drawn to Naples, Florida, in the late 1970s, fascinated

by its many waterways and employment opportunities. He worked for many years as a commercial painter and later relocated to High Springs, where he spent over a decade working for the University of Florida in the Physical Department. In his free time, when he wasn't fishing, he enjoyed gardening and exploring remote areas for fossils and Native American artifacts.

Gregg is survived by his son Aaron (Candence), Bell, Florida; brothers Thomas (June), Midland, MI, Brian (Tammy), Largo, FL, and Kevin (Kathy), Brant, MI; several nieces and nephews; and granddaughter, Brooklyn. He was predeceased by his parents, sister Patricia (Thomas) Weisgerber, and brother John (Mary Jane) McInerney.

A funeral service will be held at Blessed Trinity Catholic Church, 958 E. Tuscola St., Frankenmuth, MI, on Wednesday, October 22, 2025, at 11am, with visitation from 10am until the time of the service. Rite of Committal will immediately follow the service at Blessed Trinity Catholic Cemetery.
